The CHC website is introducing a powerful new search platform, *EBSCO Discovery Service*, to help you find the evidence-based resources you need, faster.

“Discovery” tools search across trusted, high-quality clinical resources, with advanced medical filters and direct links to full text, all through a Google-like search experience.

CHC’s discovery tool is designed for clinicians, bringing together content from multiple databases, research resources and subscribed journals into a single, streamlined search.

A smarter way to find clinical evidence

The new CHC discovery tool is primarily designed to help clinicians find research articles and evidence on a topic, without needing to search multiple databases one by one.

Simply enter your keyword, topic, or citation into the single search box and see relevant results.

It searches across a wide range of trusted resources and brings the most relevant literature results together in one place - for when you're exploring a clinical question, preparing for teaching, or just keeping current with the latest research.

✓ **Single search, multiple sources**
looking across CHC's resources at once, rather than checking each database or journal individually.

✓ **Trusted, curated content**
prioritising high quality, peer-reviewed and evidence-based full text sources relevant to healthcare and clinical practice.

✓ **Publication alert services**
automate journal monitoring to track emerging research in real time.

✓ **Author and affiliation searches**
help identify and vet emerging thought leaders by querying author name, institution, or subject field to evaluate publication activity.

✓ **Personal dashboard, search alerts, and share tools** allow researchers to set alerts, save literature sets and share permalinks with collaborators.

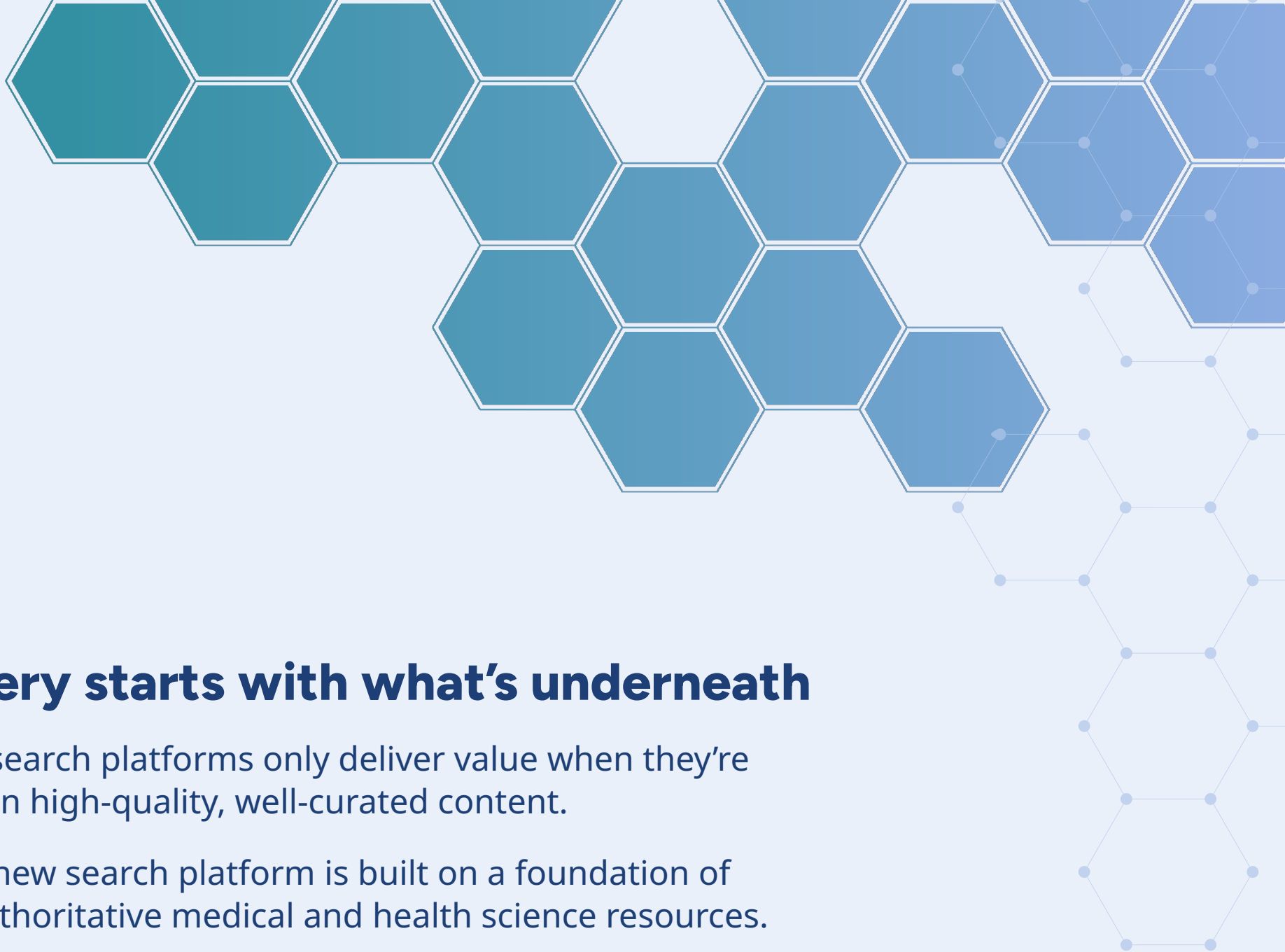

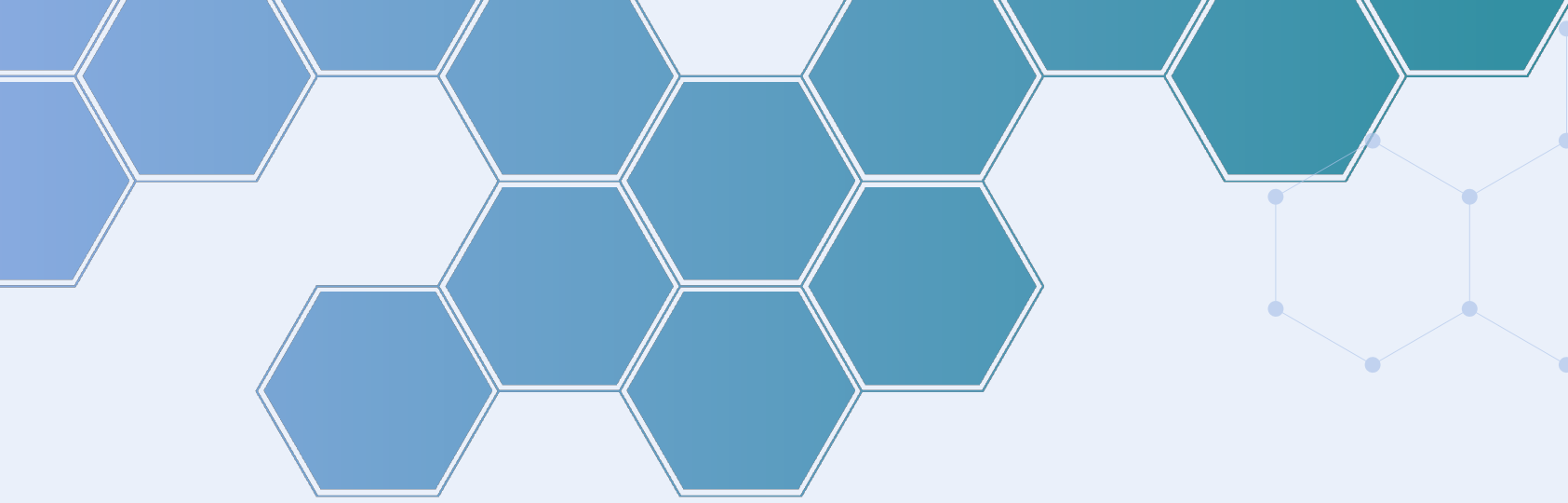
